Harbor Regional Center is a private, non-profit agency, administered by the Harbor Developmental Disabilities Foundation, Inc. and serving approximately 9,000 people with developmental disabilities and their families in southern Los Angeles County. We are funded by the State of California to provide assessment, individualized service planning and coordination, and advocacy services, free of charge, to people with developmental disabilities. Developmental disabilities include mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, and autism.

While our clients and their families receive a wide range of services and supports through the regional center, some of these people have few if any financial

or other resources to meet other personal needs. Because of this, we have established a special fund, called the Harbor Help Fund, to enable us provide the additional assistance that can be so vital to the quality of our clients' lives. This fund is supported by donations and has been used over the years for things such as emergency rent payments, clothing, food, and other supports for clients in need.

One important Harbor Help Fund enterprise is our Holiday Giving Project. Money from the Help Fund provides our neediest families with food for holiday dinners and also helps ensure that children or adults with developmental disabilities do not have a lonely or giftless holiday.

Without the generosity and thoughtful donations of our friends, none of the necessities or special "extras" provided by the Harbor Help Fund would be possible.
