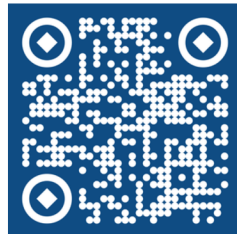

Eligibility Criteria

Depending on the age of the person seeking services, you may qualify for services if the following criteria are met.

Early Childhood (Under 3 Years)

- Have a significant developmental delay in one or more areas:
 - Cognitive
 - Communication
 - Social/Emotional
 - Adaptive
 - Physical/Motor Development (including vision and hearing)
- Have a condition with a known cause that is very likely to lead to developmental delays, or
- Be identified as likely to have a significant developmental delay

Lanterman Services (Ages 3 & Older)

- Intellectual Disability
- Cerebral Palsy
- Epilepsy
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Conditions similar to Intellectual Disability

What else should I know about eligibility for Lanterman Services?

- Onset of disability (or date of diagnosis) must be prior to 18 years of age
- Disability is expected to continue indefinitely
- Constitutes substantial limitations in at least 3 of the specific life areas:
 - Receptive and Expressive Language
 - Learning
 - Self-Care
 - Mobility
 - Self-Direction
 - Capacity for Independent Living
 - Economic Self-Sufficiency

Provisional Eligibility

Children from birth to four years of age may be provisionally eligible if they have a disability that is not solely physical in nature and have significant functional limitations in at least two of the following areas of major life activity, as determined by a regional center and as appropriate to the age of the child:

- Self-Care
- Receptive and Expressive Language
- Learning
- Mobility
- Self-Direction
