• Number of fully oriented participants: 1,268 (101 are in the follow-up stage, 401 have chosen to withdraw and 385 in the unknown stage).

Public Comments:

- Participant asked when the next Spanish orientation takes place.
- Harbor staff shared that information provided to Harbor by participants has to be provided two weeks before they go live.
- Participant asked about those that do not move forward to identify barriers.
- Participant asked why individuals are not moving forward or unsure.
- Harbor staff shared that English orientations have about 35 individuals who attend monthly, while Spanish orientations have an average of two participants per month.

SDP Live survey

- For individuals who are live in SDP. Survey sent out fill out the survey to help improve the SDP.
- Sent out to participants who have been in the program one year and over.
- Some were sent out in paper form through mail, some emailed.
- Another email reminder sent out on April 7, 2025.

Guidelight Group Updates: Rebecca LaBoriel

- Continue to work with 20-trained IFs through program to find clients.
- Work with Harbor to ensure IFs continue to receive payment.
- Focus on serving the deaf and hard of hearing with new implementation funds.

Autism Society of Los Angeles (ASLA)/Phoenix Facilitation Updates Kim Sinclair:

- 62.5 hours of support received.
- 17 certificates provided, not all participants have taken the post-test and evaluation.

Public Comments:

- Individuals should be informed of their options, their choice to explore SDP or remain in traditional.
- Committee is addressing disparity by providing coaching and increasing the number of IFs who speak numerous languages.
- 099 PDS payment updates provided.
- Negative comments are not allowed; everyone is free to share and must be respected.
- Disparity issues brought up with hope that everyone receives the same information.
- Participant shared how working with Harbor is great, makes their IF job easier.
- Participant shared that Harbor is making changes but more work is needed.

- Participant recommended that all participants go on camera, especially committee members.
- Committee members introduced themselves.
- Participant talked about barriers and the success of her son thanks to the services provided by RC, highlighting issues that are barriers for many.
- Participant shared that Harbor is being a barrier with approving spending plans and authorizations.
- Participant asked when they should start preplanning for the following budget year and if a PCP needs to be conducted annually.
- Participant shared that SDP has been great, even if there are barriers that continue to happen but is overall satisfied.
- Participant shared that orientations should be broken down into two sessions to make it easier to understand all the information.
- Participant asked if Regional Centers collaborate with each other.
- Participant shared that more individuals need to be informed about SDP and decrease the time it takes to approve spending plan changes.
- Participant shared that time limit is to ensure everyone has a chance to be heard.
- Participant shared that time limits exist whenever public comments are allowed in meetings.
- Participant shared that people want to hear about the program and create balance, not just hear complaints.
- Participant asked about rate increases.
- In SDP, the rates in place used to develop budget, are not updated unless it is for a traditional service provider.
- Participant asked about training for service coordinators to learn about SDP.
- Participant asked about federal budget cuts and if SDP will be affected.
- Participant shared funding issues for California due to fires and services provided to undocumented individuals, advising to be ready for cuts.
